Dear Mr. Friedman:

We have reviewed the information that was submitted for the aforementioned project. As required by Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as amended, and its implementing regulations, 36 CFR 800: "Protection of Historic Properties," we submit our comments.

According to the submitted information, one new workspace, MVP-ATWS-SM-093, is being proposed to address a slip that has occurred along the pipeline corridor in Wetzel County, WV and to stabilize the hillside. Workspace MVP-ATWS-SM-093 abuts the western edge of the pipeline corridor between mileposts MP 1.43 and 1.57 to the east of Fallen Timber Road. It is our understanding that the slip poses a potential risk to cemetery 46WZ142, which we determined is not eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places in our letter dated October 6, 2015. No other cultural resources were identified within the immediate vicinity. Tree clearing will be necessary. The direct and indirect areas of potential effects (APE) are consistent with those defined for the previously surveyed pipeline corridor.

Archaeological Resources:

Archaeological investigation of the newly proposed workspace included visual reconnaissance. Steep terrain and disturbance resulting from the active slip were observed. No archaeological resources were identified. As a result, we concur that no further archaeological investigations are warranted. In our opinion, use of these workspaces will have no effect on archaeological historic properties.

Architectural Resources:

We have reviewed the submitted documentation and determined no further consultation is necessary regarding the aforementioned project element. The proposed variance will occur within areas that were included in the previously established visual APE for the undertaking and no additional aboveground historic properties have been identified in the vicinity. Though the work will require tree removal in the variance area, that clearance will impose no effects on aboveground historic resources. Thus, no further consultation is necessary regarding this project element; however, we ask that you contact our office if the project should change.
