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Dear Mr. Friedman:

We have reviewed the information that was submitted for the aforementioned project. As required by Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as amended, and its implementing regulations, 36 CFR 800: "Protection of Historic Properties," we submit our comments.

According to the submitted information, one workspace, MVP-ATWS-SM-061 (Ext) is being proposed to stabilize the hillside and address a slip that has occurred in Wetzel County, WV along the pipeline corridor near milepost (MP) 46.8 – 46.89 to the west of Churchville Road near Camden. The currently proposed workspace, which covers 0.47 hectare, is an extension of previously reviewed workspace MVP-ATWS-SM-061. Tree clearing will be necessary for this workspace. The direct and indirect areas of potential effects (APE) are consistent with those defined for the previously surveyed pipeline corridor.

Archaeological Resources:

As the submitted materials state, previously recorded archaeological site 46LE92 is located within MVP-ATWS-SM-061, as it was originally proposed, and was impacted by the active slip. The currently proposed variance will extend the workspace further to the east, away from the site's location. Survey of this area included visual reconnaissance and shovel probe excavation. No cultural materials were encountered. We concur that no further archaeological investigations are warranted for this proposed variance. In our opinion, use of this workspace extension will have no effect on archaeological historic properties.

Architectural Resources:

We have reviewed the submitted report and determined no further consultation is necessary regarding the aforementioned project variance. The submitted documentation indicated no *historic* architectural resources are located within the direct APE, nor were any such properties identified within the indirect APE that might have a view of the proposed workspace. The variance is also located within the previously established visual APE for the overall undertaking, which has already been evaluated for potential effects on historic properties. Thus, no further consultation is necessary regarding these project elements; however, we ask that you contact our office if the project should change.
