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## **METHODS FOR CRITERIA OF EFFECTS ASSESSMENT**

This document details the methods that will be used to evaluate potential impacts to architectural and historic resources (historic resources) associated with the proposed Mountain Valley Pipeline Project (Project) in Virginia. These impact analyses are intended to comply with the requirements of both NEPA and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and were developed in accordance with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation’s regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (36 CFR 800, Protection of Historic Properties).

### **Identification of Historic Properties**

To date, 330 historic resources have been identified by MVP’s historic architecture survey. As a result of route modifications due to consultations with federal and state agencies, engineering refinements, landowner discussions, and consideration of stakeholder input; and, in an effort to move to the next stage of the Section 106 Review Process—Criteria of Effects Assessment—MVP has compiled a *Master List of Identified Historic Resources* (Master List), identified NRHP-eligible and -listed historic resources, within the proposed Project Direct and Indirect Area of Potential Effects in Virginia (Appendix 1). This list accounts for individual resources, six (6) previously recorded and two (2) newly identified historic districts, and *primary* resources contributing to the eight (8) historic districts. In order to avoid impacts to historic resources, the list will continue to be altered as the Project alignment is better refined.<sup>1</sup>

Since significance for cultural resources is determined by a resource’s eligibility for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP), historic resources that have been determined not eligible, and thereby not historic properties as defined by Section 106, will not be evaluated for proposed Project impacts and were not included in the Master List. Additionally, the NRHP status of some historic resources remains undetermined due to limited or denied access during field survey. For the purposes of identifying potential Project impacts, resources that remain unevaluated or have a NRHP status of undetermined are, for this analysis, considered as eligible for listing in the NRHP. Likewise, any *primary* resources located within historic districts that have not been determined to be contributing or non-contributing resources and have an “unknown” status are considered as “contributing” and eligible for listing in the NRHP.

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<sup>1</sup> The eight historic districts include the newly-identified Bent Mountain and Big Stony Creek Rural Historic Districts in addition to the North Fork Valley, Coles-Terry, and Greater Newport Rural Historic Districts; and the Newport, Appalachian Trail and Blue Ridge Parkway Historic Districts—all of which were previously recorded.

## **Methods for Criteria of Effects Assessment**

The Master List will serve as the basis for Mountain Valley's Criteria of Effects Assessment as described below:

### **Task 1: Indirect APE Digital Elevation Modeling with National Land Cover Database (NLCD) Data**

The Indirect APE developed for the Project was based on a digital elevation model (DEM) that accounted topography and current land uses around the pipeline.<sup>2</sup> The Indirect APE took into consideration the longer viewing distances that exist at higher elevations, as well as the shorter viewing distances at lower elevations, resulting in an undulating Project Indirect APE. In general, the Indirect APE was narrower in the eastern counties and wider, in response to topography, in the westernmost counties of the Project route in Virginia. This bare-earth digital DEM did not factor in existing vegetation in an effort to provide a worst-case scenario in terms of viewing angles.

For the purposes of the Criteria of Effects Assessment, the Indirect APE DEM will be reviewed with an overlay of the locations of resources included in the Master List and an overlay of National Land Cover Data (NLCD) data. Using NLCD data set at a moderate height of 40 feet and distance to project features, this model will account for screening that the vegetation adjacent to the resources would provide. This model would then be used by Mountain Valley's historic architecture team (team) to identify those resources that will not be subject to indirect visual impacts from the Project (i.e. the Project would result in no effect to these resources) and the resources would therefore be eliminated from further impact assessment.

### **Task 2: Viewshed Analysis**

Viewshed analysis will be performed for the remaining resources, those not eliminated in Task 1, and will take into consideration several factors including:

- NLCD data and identified intervening vegetation
- distance to the nearest Project feature (e.g. permanent right-of-way and temporary and permanent ancillary features)
- identified man-made features that may provide visual screening
- identified areas where permanent changes to the landscape will occur as a result of the Project construction (i.e. tree clearing).

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<sup>2</sup> Prior to beginning the field survey, New South Associates and Tetra Tech met with VDHR staff in Richmond on April 21, 2015 in order to develop an appropriate APE for historic architecture. It was agreed that the APE for historic architectural resources should be comprised, at a minimum, of a 450-foot corridor centered on either side of the pipeline (75 feet was added to either side of the 300-foot direct effects APE) and that in some areas the APE should be expanded to take into account the longer viewing distances that exist at the higher elevations. As a result of these discussions and a subsequent digital elevation model created by Tetra Tech, the APE was expanded up to one mile on either side of the pipeline in areas of higher elevation. In a May 20, 2015 letter, VDHR concurred that the Indirect APE was appropriately defined and accurately reflected previous consultation.

- viewsheds will extend to 3-miles to account for any potential long distance views of Project features on adjacent high relief terrain

This series of viewsheds would then be used by the team to analyze the nature of the potential impact of the Project on these resources and distinguish between resources that will be subject to only temporary impacts and those that will be subject to permanent indirect (viewshed) impacts. Based on these analyses, resources that will undergo temporary impacts would be categorized as subject to an effect (a view) but not an adverse effect. These resources would be eliminated from further effects assessment. Resources that will be subject to permanent indirect impacts will be assessed further taking into consideration their historic significance and the aspects of integrity.

### **Task 3: Consideration of Historic Significance and Aspects of Integrity**

The team will evaluate the changes and alterations Project features will introduce, physically and visually, to the remaining historic resources that may sustain permanent viewshed impacts. As noted in the description of Task 2, the visibility of Project features from an historic resource may not cause an adverse effect. Historic properties convey their significance through their integrity (location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association). Task 3 will involve assessing each of the remaining historic resources in terms of the criteria under which the properties were considered historically significant and evaluating whether the introduction of Project features has the potential to adversely affect the property's integrity.

### **Task 4: Photo Simulations**

Following the team's assessment of potential adverse effects, a series of photo simulations will be prepared to provide visual confirmation of the findings. The photo simulations would demonstrate the extent, or lack, of potential Project effects for selected resources.

The results of Tasks 1 through 4 will be prepared for presentation and discussion with VDHR staff. Following that discussion, the draft report will be finalized summarizing the methods implemented and the results.

### **Task 5: Draft Criteria of Effects Report**

Following the meeting with VDHR staff, the draft report will be finalized and will describe: the methods used for the project effects analysis including development of the Master List; the selection of resources for which photo simulations were prepared; discussion of Project effects, identification of avoidance measures as appropriate; and recommendations for further actions to address Project impacts, if needed, should any prove to qualify as adverse effects to significant historic resources.

2. A table of all potentially affected resources. In similar format to Phase I reports, effects to each resource will be discussed and illustrated with a viewshed analysis. This will be informed by discussions with VDHR that will have taken place following Task 4.

V. Summary and Recommendations: Summarize effects recommendations.

Any resources determined by VDHR to be adversely affected based on the team's Criteria of Effects Assessment, will require avoidance or mitigation. A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) would be prepared by the VDHR that would outline the specific steps that would be taken to mitigate adverse effects to significant properties.
