We have reviewed additional information that representatives of Tetra Tech submitted for the aforementioned undertaking. As required by Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and its implementing regulations, U.S. 36 CFR § 800: "Protection of Historic Properties," we submit our comments.

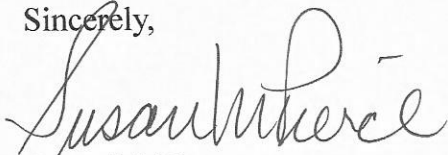
In a letter dated January 27, 2016 (FR: 15-67-MULTI-12) our office concurred with Tetra Tech's recommendation that the Carter Residence (SHPO ID no. FA-0002-0042) in Fayette County, West Virginia was eligible for individual inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C for architectural significance. We did not concur with the recommendation that it was eligible under Criterion A for association with agricultural developments. After further survey of the property, Tetra Tech, on behalf of Mountain Valley Pipeline, has requested that our office reconsider this determination.

We have reviewed the submitted information and concur with the consultant's recommendation that the Carter Residence is no longer eligible for inclusion in the National Register under Criterion C. It has experienced a significant loss of integrity in the form of design, materials, and workmanship, which has directly affected the historic characteristics that might have qualified it for inclusion under architectural significance. Since the property was first documented in the early 1990s, it has deteriorated significantly and, in our opinion, is no longer individually eligible. No further consultation is necessary regarding the Carter Residence; however, we ask that you contact our office if the project should change.
