This report presents the results of a Phase I survey for a proposed temporary workspace located within the limits of disturbance of the Mountain Valley Pipeline Project in Nicholas County, West Virginia. Additionally, the report also includes the results of a Phase II investigation at archaeological site 46NI859 and a treatment plan for archaeological site 46NI859. 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
