Ms. Farrar,

I'm following up on some conversations and emails you had back in March with John Centofanti of EQT related to the Mountain Valley Pipeline and mitigation of impacts on the North Fork Rural Historic District. Mountain Valley had proposed that it would work with the Montgomery Museum to develop an exhibit and provide funding for certain activities as a possible mitigation. We received a letter from your board dated March 7, 2018, that raised concerns with our proposal. In addition, the Montgomery County attorney filed comments on the FERC docket related to our proposed mitigation (in letters dated March 5 and March 23, 2018).

We would like to schedule a call or meeting to continue this dialogue and review possible opportunities to work with the museum on developing mitigation measures that are appropriate in scale to the impacts on the historic district and that would further the long-term goals of the museum to see if a mutually agreed-upon plan can be developed and implemented. Please let us know if the museum staff and/or board is willing to discuss this with Mountain Valley representatives in the near future so that we can schedule this at your convenience. If the museum is not interested in working with us, I would appreciate it if you could let us know this so that we make alternative plans.

We appreciate your attention to this matter and look forward to discussing options with you in the near future.
